



God and Israel

God chooses those He will save through faith in the gospel. We are responsible for our rejection of Him and His gospel. So the Jews are responsible for their refusal to turn to Christ; and they have not come to faith because God has not chosen to have mercy on them. That is the summary of the teachings of Romans 9 and 10. But therefore the question remains: "Did God reject His people? (Romans 11:1). Did God reject ethnic Israel? After all the promises God made to Abraham and David, and so many others throughout Israel's history, why doesn't God turn their hearts to Him? Has He now utterly abandoned them? Paul immediately answers the question with a big *NO!* The rest of Romans 11 details why He answers *no* – and his central argument is: *God has not rejected Israel, because Israel's unbelief is not total.*
