

Matthew 9:17 "Neither is new wine put into old wineskins. If it is, the skins burst and the wine is spilled and the skins are destroyed. But new wine is put into fresh wineskins, and so both are

preserved." When wine was made and first began to ferment, it was put into wineskins made from animal skins, often goat skins, which had certain elasticity. As the fermenting continued, the new wineskin could expand to accommodate the gases that were escaping in the process. But old wineskin had already been stretched to its capacity, so if new wine were put in it, it would not have sufficient elasticity to withstand the fermentation process and would burst. Both the wine and the wineskin would be ruined. But again, Jesus acknowledged that no one would do such a thing. The problem was known, and because the wine was valuable, no one put it in old wineskins.

Jesus used the example of wineskins – as well as that of an unshrunk cloth – to explain to John's disciples that something new had come. Jesus was effectively saying that a new age and a new covenant had come. He had come to bring radical change, so radical that it was no longer possible to continue in the old ways.

In the Old Covenant the people of God were to follow God by keeping the law and the prophets. We have already heard Jesus say that He has not come to abolish the law and the prophets, but to fulfill them. This means that now under the new covenant that we are now called to put on Christ (Romans 13:14). Our God wants us body and soul. He does not call us to dabble in religion. He commands us to commit ourselves to Him from the depths of our souls. Christianity is not a part-time thing. There really is a sense in which it is all or nothing at all. But even the disciples of John the Baptist did not get it. They did not understand – because it truly takes an indwelling of God's Spirit to open the eyes of His children to this spiritual reality.

You can order flowers in memory or in honor of a loved one. If you wish, we will include the information in our Easter Worship Services Bulletin on Sunday, March 31st.


