Did You Know?

What does the New Testament have to say about infant baptism?

One passage that sheds some light on this question can be found in the Apostle Paul's letter to the Colossians. He writes, "In Him you were also circumcised with the circumcision made without hands, by putting off the body of the sins of the flesh, by the circumcision of Christ, buried with Him in baptism, in which you also were raised with Him through faith in the working of God, who raised Him from the dead" (Colossians 2:11-12). In this text, Paul does not identify circumcision with baptism, but he does clearly show that there is continuity between them. Also, he makes clear that the circumcision that is made without hands is a spiritual circumcision that is signified by baptism. In his epistle to the Romans, he argues against those among the Pharisees and rabbis who believed that circumcision automatically puts people in a state of salvation (2:25-29). Many people in the history of Christendom have argued that baptism brings a person into a state of salvation through baptismal regeneration. For instance, in the Roman Catholic Church, baptismal regeneration is said to occur for all who receive the sacrament. One of the main reasons why Baptists historically have rejected infant baptism is to do away with this idea. So, Paul's concern over circumcision should be shared by all Christians with regard to baptism – baptism does not save. We are required to receive it, certainly as adults, arguably as infants, but even as adults the sacrament alone does not save us.
