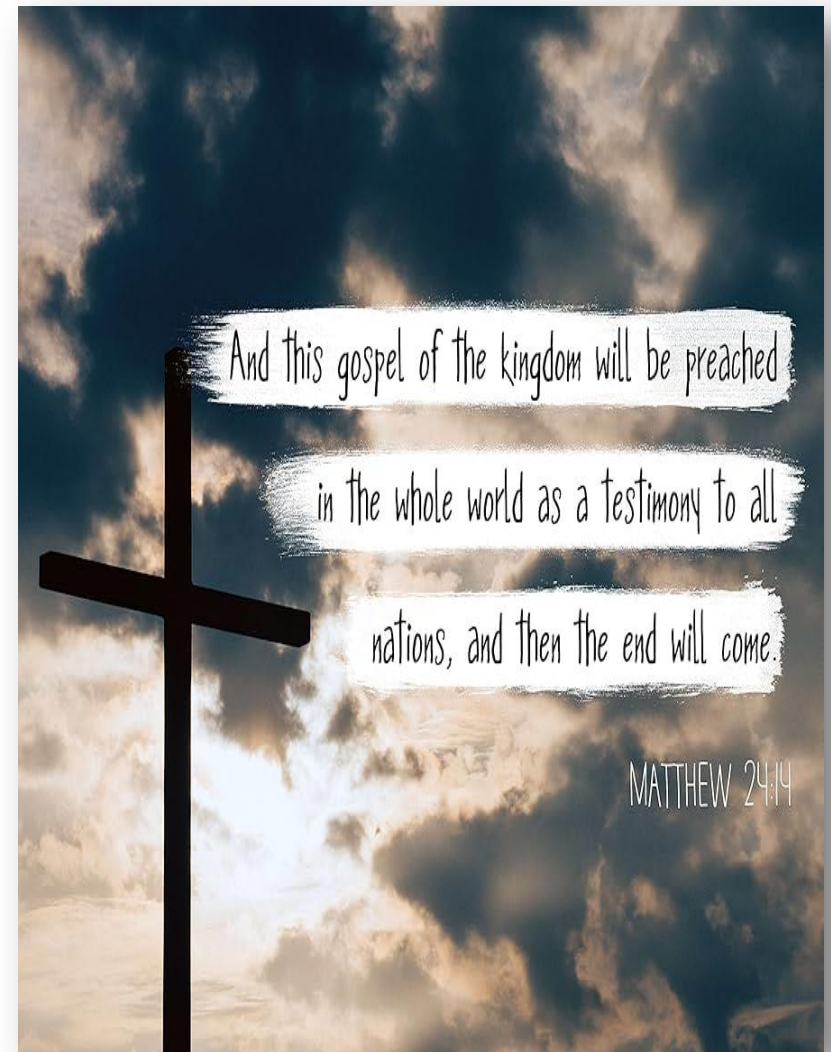

History tells us that the siege of Jerusalem created horrible conditions inside the city. Titus allowed Jewish pilgrims to enter the city for the Passover, but then refused to let them leave. As a result, the city was vastly overcrowded. Supplies soon ran low and many starved. Then, of course, there was a terrible slaughter when the Romans finally breached the walls, according to Josephus. The capture and sack of Jerusalem did indeed bring terrible tribulation upon those in the city. Yet Josephus reports various events that shortened the length of the siege, probably allowing for more survivors than reasonably could have been expected. His testimony supports Jesus' statement that those days of tribulation had been shortened by God for the sake of His elect. I believe that those who want to see these words of Jesus as a prophecy of a great tribulation that is still yet to come must grant that there was at least an initial fulfillment in AD 70. Jesus clearly was warning His contemporaries about a disaster that was just around the corner.
